The Department of Public Safety (DPS) comprises sworn and civilian employees who work 24/7 to protect and serve the Loyola community. Civilian employees include dispatchers who work in the state-of-the-art Communications Center and lock and key staff who manage locksmithing across the University. DPS also provides various services to support the campus community, including security escorts, lockout assistance for your campus residence, jumpstarts for your vehicle (with a signed waiver), and lost and found property.

Greyhound Alerts

Greyhound Alerts is Loyola's emergency notification system used to send timely warnings and emergency notifications to the campus community. Greyhound Alerts uses Everbridge and Alertus systems to send text messages, emails, and computer-based notifications to mobile devices and to active Loyola-owned computers and digital signboards.

The Greyhound Alert system is an opt-out system that updates daily with student and employee contact information. Campus community members can update their Greyhound Alert accounts through the "Inside Loyola" portal. Students can add parent or guardian contact information through their account ports so they can also receive alert information.

Emergency Blue Light Phones

Over 70 emergency blue light phones are <u>placed across campus</u>, providing a direct line to the DPS Communications Center. All blue light phones are tested every semester to ensure reliable operation.

Annual Security & Fire Safety Report (ASFSR): The <u>ASFSR</u> contains policies for the Evergreen campus; the Graduate Center at Timonium; the International House in Leuven, Belgium; and the Loyola Clinical Centers at Belvedere Square. The ASFSR includes statistics for the previous three calendar years, including reported crimes on campus, in certain off-campus buildings and properties owned or controlled by Loyola University Maryland, and on public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus. This report also includes institutional policies and procedures concerning campus security, sexual assault, the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA), and fire safety. All policy statements apply to all campuses.

Strategic Plan



Waste: Landfill, Recycling, Compost

Loyola has three waste streams on campus: landfill, recycling, and compost. Empty plastic bottles, aluminum cans, paper, and flattened cardboard can all be recycled on campus. To reduce contamination, if you are in doubt, throw it out! Learn more about Loyola's waste practices.

Community Compost

As part of the Baltimore Comprehensive Composting Pilot in partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS), the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, Department of Public Works, Johns Hopkins University, and the University of Maryland – Baltimore, Loyola offers a community compost drop-off site at 5104 York Rd (site of the Govanstowne Farmer's Market). The collection bin is located next to the community fridge. The overarching goal of the Baltimore Comprehensive Composting Pilot is to increase Baltimore City residents' and communities' access to composting and food waste reduction opportunities by removing long standing educational, social, and economic barriers. 

The award is meant to recognize distinctive achievement in the past year in the context of a successful career and ongoing research agenda.

Beginning in 2017, this faculty award honors Loyola's commitment to academic excellence and the highest standards of scholarship in a given field. It joins the Distinguished Teacher of the Year as a status conferred upon a tenured colleague. Selection is based on department nominations to a small committee of academic leaders and past award recipients. The recipient will be announced on Maryland Day. Colleagues who have been nominated in the past may be re-nominated. Colleagues can only receive the award once.

Beginning in Spring 2022, the Faculty Award for Excellence in Digital Teaching Practice recognizes a colleague for their innovative use of technology for teaching and learning. Digital teaching practice takes many forms, ranging from using technology to address pressing student needs such as building community and ensuring equity, leveraging technology to advance high impact practices in face-to-face or online settings, and using existing classroom technology to expand learning beyond the physical classroom space. This faculty award honors the creativity and skillful use of technology and digital teaching practices to engage students and promote learning at either the undergraduate or graduate level and within any course modalities: in-person, hybrid, or fully online. A faculty member from one college or school is recognized each year on a rotating basis. Self, peer, or department chair nominations are made to a committee of academic administrators, instructional designers in the Office of Digital Teaching and Learning, and previous Digital Pedagogy Fellows. Nominees are asked to submit additional information describing their digital teaching practice and learning outcomes. The recipient is announced each year at the annual Faculty Excellence Celebration (formerly Deans' Symposium). Any current full-time faculty member is eligible to receive the award. Colleagues who have been nominated in the past may be re-nominated. A faculty member can only receive the award once. Awardees receive a plague and an honorarium.

Faculty Award for Excellence in Graduate Teaching

The Faculty Award for Excellence in Graduate Teaching recognizes a colleague for commitment to outstanding teaching in Loyola's graduate programs. Beginning in 2017, this faculty award honors the unique efforts of faculty teaching in graduate programs as they work to facilitate graduate student development as effective leaders and change agents. Selection is based on department and student nominations to a small committee of graduate academic administrators. The recipient will be announced at Maryland Day. Colleagues who have been nominated in the past may be re-nominated. Colleagues can only receive the award once.

Selection is based on alumni nominations to a small committee of academic administrators, past recipients, and an alumni affairs representative. The recipient will be announced this year at Loyola's Maryland Day Events.

To nominate a faculty member, alumni may submit a brief nomination (up to 250 words) describing their role as a mentor at Loyola and the influence on post-Loyola success.

Starting in 2017, this faculty award showcases our faculty's shared commitment to the Jesuit core value of magis, a constant challenge to improve. The Committee on Teaching Enhancement selects a teaching practice that best exemplifies a commitment to imaginative and effective teaching, based on peer nomination. Each year's honored colleague shows us all what is possible, in the classroom and beyond. The recipient will be announced at Maryland Day.
